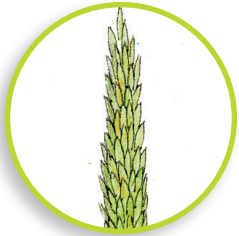




CANINE & FELINE GRASS ALLERGENS

(*Anthoxanthum odoratum*)



*April - July

PERENNIAL RYE

(*Lolium perenne*)



*May - August

MEADOW FESCUE

(*Festuca elatior*)



*May - September

MEADOW GRASS

(*Poa pratensis*)



*May - September

TIMOTHY GRASS

(*Phleum pratense*)



*May - September

REDTOP

(*Agrostis alba*)



*May - September

ORCHARD GRASS

(*Dactylis glomerata*)



*June - September

TIPS ON REDUCING EXPOSURE

- Exercise your pet on well-cut paths and pavements; avoiding areas with long flowering grasses
- Regularly groom, wipe over with a damp cloth or rinse your pet off with water, especially after exposure to long grass
- Mow your lawn regularly to keep the grass short
- Keep your pet indoors when grass is being cut in the area
- Monitor your local pollen forecast
- Be aware that species related to the named allergen can also be problematic
